Assessment of sedentary behaviour at work: what tools can be implemented?

Sedentary behaviour, defined as seated posture associated with very low energy expenditure, can be monitored using an accelerometer placed on the thigh linked to an estimation of energy expenditure.

The risks linked to nanoparticles and endocrine disruptors, atmospheric pollution, and exposure to smoke from fires, were addressed in particular.

Three sessions with invited speakers on biomonitoring of occupational exposure, medication and work, cardiac health and work were organised, among others, during this symposium.

The presentations at this symposium questioned the temporality of work and employment and their effects on health, as well as democracy in the workplace (alternative organisation, management transformation).
