It merges InVS (French Institute for Public Health Surveillance), INPES (French Institute for Health Promotion and Health Education) and EPRUS (Establishment for Public Health Emergency Preparedness and Response), taking on all their missions, competencies and powers.

## Vaccinations in occupational health

In the workplace, vaccination is part of an overall approach to prevent biological risks. The strategy is developed by the employer in collaboration with the occupational physician and the CHSCT (health, safety and working conditions committees).

#### **FIELD VIEW**

Handling monoclonal antibodies (mAb) in healthcare settings. Practices and preventive measures The survey of workers handling mAb and hospital-based occupational physicians shows a large range of possible exposure scenarios, but mainly highlights poor knowledge of the risks entailed.
